Learning About Your Local Government

Thank you for your interest in the City of North Bend's 2026 Citizens Academy!

The North Bend Citizens Academy is a free, eight-week interactive course designed to provide an in-depth look into how your local municipal government operates. Participants will:

- Learn more about the City of North Bend government operations and services
- Participate in dialogues with city leaders, city staff, and other civic-minded residents
- See taxpayers' investments at work
- Learn about opportunities to become more involved in your local government

Classes start on February 2, 2026

Applications are accepted November 6 until the course reaches capacity. Space is limited to 25 applicants.

How to register and complete the academy:

1. Submit a completed application via email (bkeveren@northbendwa.gov), via mail (Attn: Bre Keveren, 920 SE Cedar Falls Way, North Bend, WA 98045), or deliver a printed copy to City Hall (920 SE Cedar Falls Way).

2. Receive confirmation and acceptance: Once you submit your application, we will email you confirmation and acceptance.

* Due to a limited class size, priority for application acceptance will be granted to residents located within the city limits of North Bend. **Please still feel free to apply should your home be located outside city limits!** We will contact you as soon as possible to confirm your application acceptance. If you live outside city limits, you will receive a separate email that notifies you of acceptance into Citizens Academy.

3. Simply show up and have fun getting to know your local municipality!

4. Receive your certificate of completion. Once all courses are completed, join your fellow attendees at the April 7th Citizens Academy Recognition event, where you will be recognized by the North Bend City Council and receive your certificate. Please consider staying until 7 p.m. so that Mayor Miller and the Council can recognize you publicly at the City Council meeting that will begin immediately following the event.

February 2 - Welcome, City History, and Operations Overview with Mayor Mary Miller, City Administrator Amber Emery and Deputy Director of the Snoqualmie Valley Historical Museum, Cristy Lake: Learn about how our city operates, and learn about the history of North Bend. Ask questions, discuss history and current city operations topics.

February 9 - Records, Law, Open Government, Administration and Public Information with City Clerk Susie Oppedal, City Attorney Kendra Rosenberg, Administrative Services Director Lisa Escobar, HR Manager Erin DeBerg, and Communications Manager Bre Keveren: Learn about records retention, legal authority, open government, administration, and how the city disseminates information to the public.

Learn also about how the city collaborates and works through emergencies.
