## We've Been Listening:

We have heard frustrations about parking downtown and lack of available parking, with premiere parking stalls in front of shops being occupied for hours at a time.



### What the City is doing:

- i. One of the projects council approved this year is to restripe Main Street with angled parking. This project will get an additional 15 stalls.
- ii. In June 2017 City Council added a parking lot to our Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). This was done in response to concerns both staff and city council have heard regarding lack of adequate parking downtown.

### What Businesses can do:


- i. Ensure you and your employees are parking in off-site parking areas that are not right in front of you or your neighbors business. The Park n Ride located across from the Pour House, and the public lot by Park Street and North Bend Way are two great offsite parking lots for long term employee parking. Please remind your employees to keep the premier spots open for our citizens and visitors.
- ii. We have seen, and heard complaints about people parking on the new sidewalk. We understand that because the sidewalk is the same grade as the street, it can be confusing where the parking stalls end and the sidewalk begins. New signs are going to be installed stating "No Parking" which will help educate users and allow police to enforce this issue. Let's keep our new sidewalks clear for pedestrians and ensure the new investment lasts.

## Save the Date: North Bend Block Party 2018

One of our biggest city events, the North Bend Block Party, will be taking place on Saturday July 21st 2018. This popular festival fosters community pride and engagement while providing an economic boost to our downtown businesses by bringing in more foot traffic to the downtown Core and North Bend in general. We have decided to bring in new music talent this year and will be considering bands other than Spike and the Impalers and Heart by Heart. We all have loved these bands but think it is time to shake things up.

To ensure that this event positively impacts local businesses to its fullest potential, we are calling all interested merchants to participate in an Advisory Committee for our Block Party. This committee will be focused on increasing merchant participation and providing insight and ideas on how the Block Party can benefit our businesses as well as choosing our musical talent.
