OCT 13 North Bend Way ADA Improvement Project

The North Bend Way ADA Improvement Project is nearly complete, with an expected completion date of October 13. This project improves the sidewalk on the north side of North Bend Way, between Downing and Ballarat, improving pedestrian safety as well as mobility, and links our new Downtown Plaza Project which is nearing completion and our North Bend Way / Park Street Roundabout project that will start construction next year.

Downtown Plaza Project

The Downtown Plaza Project is well under way, with an expected completion date of October 25. The project will create significant pedestrian and traffic calming improvements at the North Bend Way / Main Street intersection. Sidewalk improvements extend on North Bend Way to the west to Bendigo Blvd, and to the east to Ballarat Ave. The goal of the project is to help stimulate the economic core of North Bend by upgrading the aging public infrastructure and creating an attractive and safe environment to shop, dine and gather. This investment into the revitalization of the downtown core will help provide an attractive atmosphere for citizens and tourists to do business.
